

Range Rules (revised Sept 14, 2006)

Keep this page for future reference.

1. No Alcoholic Beverages allowed on the NCRGC range or anywhere on the Weaver Ranch property.
2. No Hunting allowed on the NCRGC range or anywhere on the Weaver Ranch property.
3. Do not shoot when there is livestock downrange! When in doubt, call a "cease fire" until the livestock moves off.
4. Every member is required to participate in one range cleanup each year. Range cleanups are run by the Club Range Master and conducted 10:00 – 12:-- on the first Saturday of each month, followed by a BBQ. Please notify Range Master of your special skills, tools and equipment.
5. We operate a cold range. There will be NO GUN HANDLING DURING A CEASE FIRE. Whoever calls "cease fire", becomes the Range Officer until a "range is hot, commence firing" is called by that individual. All shooters on the firing line should repeat "cease fire" before moving down range and "range is hot" before commencing fire. Actions must be open & clear of ammunition while on the firing line during a cease fire and at all times when off the firing line. If a shooter has a problem unloading his firearm he must let the other shooters know to prevent them from going downrange while his firearm is still loaded. Unloaded guns in sealed cases may be carried to or from a vehicle and shooting bench during cease fire, but the case must be left sealed with gun inside.
6. Absolutely no tracer or armor piercing ammunition is to be used. The tracer ammo could start a grass fire and the armor piercing ammo damages the steel gong targets. Do not place targets on or in front of the steel rails or target frames. They are expensive to the club and difficult to replace.
7. Shotgun Range – use shotguns with size 6 or smaller shot only. No slugs, rifles or pistols to be fired on the Shotgun Range!
8. Rifle and Pistol Range (Upper Range) rifles, pistols and shotguns are allowed. Clay pigeons are allowed on the Upper Range as stationary targets only. Full auto, burst fire and "bump shooting" is not allowed.
9. Hand gun and Air gun Range (lower) only pistols, revolvers and air guns are allowed. Shoot only at target, not at rocks on ground or rock background, to prevent ricochets.
10. Pick up all spent casings and especially any misfired ammunition. Help keep your range clean and safe. Remember that high winds blow loose trash around.
11. Shoot only at proper targets. Do not use glass, loose particle board, rocks or metal objects (except proper steel targets placed at least 25 yards in front of firing line) for targets. Yes, this includes your computer. Remove your used targets when you are done shooting.
12. Members are not allowed to drive vehicles downrange to set or remove targets. Handicapped members can contact the Club Secretary for an exception and receive a windshield pass.
13. Everyone is required to wear both eye and hearing protection while on or near the firing line as part of good safety. The club member is responsible for guests, children and pets while at the range. Children should not be allowed to wander the range unsupervised.
14. Guests are allowed to shoot, **with a member present**, two times a year. The member who invites a guest must review these Range Rules with their guest before shooting. Membership information is available on our website www.ncrgc.org for those who want unlimited access to our club facilities.
15. Failure to observe these Range Rules or to otherwise act as to jeopardize other persons or property is cause for revocation of range privileges and/or club membership upon review of such actions by the NCRGC Board of Directors as provided for in the Bylaws.
16. Members must wear their ID badge so that it is visible at all times while on range property.
17. Due to possible fire hazard, exploding targets are not allowed.
