

# NCRGC Emergency Procedures

- Take charge of the situation
  - Determine seriousness of injury and assign duties, if others are around to assist (Colorado has a Good Samaritan Law)
- Render aid
  - Use the NCRGC First Aid Kit for routine injuries
  - Use the NCRGC Trauma Kit for emergencies (e.g., gunshot wound)
- Call for help via your cell phone, if needed
  - Dial 911 for ambulance, poison control, fire, Larimer County Sherriff, Fort Collins Police, etc.
- Direct help to the location, if needed
  - Physical address is 4809 W. County Road 72, Laporte CO
  - From Fort Collins: US 287 to County Road #72 (Owl Canyon). Turn right and go ½ mile to range entrance on right. Cross cattle guard (give them the gate combo) and then follow the gravel road for about 1 mile to ranges.
  - From I-25: Take Exit #281 (Owl Canyon Road Exit) and go West on County Road #70 (asphalt ends 6.4 miles). Go 1 mile further to Weaver Ranch, turn North (right) and travel 1.2 miles to County Road #72. Turn West (left) and travel 2.6 miles to range entrance on left. Cross cattle guard (give them the gate combo) and then follow the gravel road for about 1 mile to ranges.
- Take notes
  - Complete the NCRGC Injury Report Form and contact the Chief Range Safety Officer (CRSO) as soon as possible. Go to the NCRGC website ([www.ncrgc.org](http://www.ncrgc.org)) and then NCRGC Leadership to find the contact information for the CRSO.
