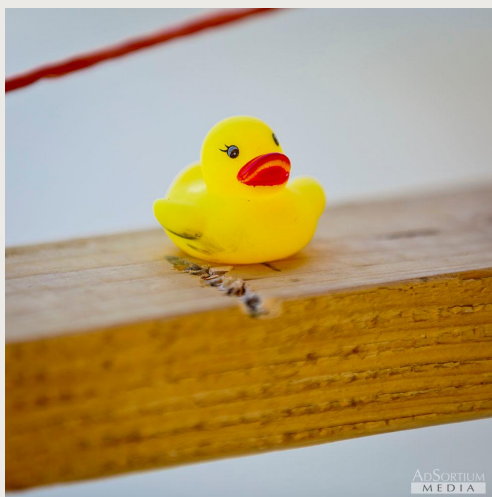
With the current ammo concerns, we are "modifying" the stages in that each shooter may chose to hit each target only once. You can chose to shoot as much, or as little as you want. If you would like to shoot only 50 or 100 rounds, that is perfectly fine. Personally, I would prefer people come out to shoot less to practice their skills and accuracy than not shoot because they don't want to shoot 200 to 300 rounds.

Last month we brought out a swinging target that hasn't been used in a long time. We will continue to introduce more and more target options that haven't been out of the Defensive Pistol conex for years with the more participation we have. The addition of new stages and set-ups not seen for some time are great to see with more people involved and designing more stages that challenge every level of shooter.

6th Annual Rimfire Carnival

The 6th Annual Rimfire Carnival will be held on Saturday, August 14, 2021 from 10 am to 3 pm. This safe, family friendly event is open to the public and there will be 20 stages including bowling pins, aliens, playing cards, pencils, ducks, steel, zombies, etc. Every stage that you "win" gets you a raffle ticket good for numerous prizes including firearms! Stages are set up to accommodate both rifle and handgun in .22 LR only (no centerfire). All

firearms must be unloaded and cased (no holsters) until you are on the firing line under the direction of a Range Safety Officer. Please bring approximately 200 rounds of .22 LR ammo as each stage is a max of 10 shots. \$15 admission includes lunch. Limited to the first 80 shooters who preregister and prepay. Spectators are welcome to attend. The Rifle Range is closed during this annual event starting at sunrise.

Hunter's Education Course

New Rules for NRL 22 Season

NRL22 published new rules for the 2021-2022 NRL22 season and here are a few examples:

- Shooters will only be allowed to take a position on any prop while on the clock and shooting the stage. This will ensure that they do not gain an advantage and helps to move the match along. However, this rule is at the discretion of the Match Director.
- To incentivize more NRL22 memberships we added this "Additionally, for every subsequent match after the first match, the shooter's name will be entered into the random box to increase their ability to win a prize from our sponsors.
- Range Officers will ensure that the shooter's chamber is cleared and chamber flag/block inserted prior to them moving their rifle off the firing line.
- Base class MSRP has been increased to \$1200. Hand grips are allowed to be changed. A list of out of date base class rifles/scopes will be published that will be allowed to stay in base class.
- Shooters must pick one class to shoot at the beginning of a local monthly shoot or the National Championship. The shooter is only eligible for placement in the class in which they signed up.
- No equipment restrictions for any class; however, tripods and shooting sticks will never be allowed.
- Environmental conditions, slight difference in Course of Fire interpretation, use of the different options in the course of fire and local match sizes are inevitably going to be different.
- The National Championship match is to be held May 27-29 of 2022 in St. Louis, Missouri hosted by Jason McBride and the Bench Rest Rifle Club of St. Louis.
